Ann Bankowski elected PAC-MI President

Ann Bankowski was elected the President of the Polish American Congress Michigan Division (PAC-MI) at the annual membership meeting on Saturday, March 14, at the PNA Hall in Hamtramck.

Bankowski was the only nominated candidate for the post of PAC-MI President. Mariusz Szajnert, who was the PAC-MI President for the last eight years, decided not to run for re-election.

Bankowski is following in the footsteps of her father, Kazimierz Olejarczyk, who passed away last year. Mr. Olejarczyk devoted his entire adult life to Polish American Congress (for 16 years he served as the President of PAC-MI).

The election of officers and board members was conducted by the Nominating Committee led by Hon. Judge John Chmura.

The full list of elected officers and board members is printed on this page. They were all sworn-in during the Installation Banquet on March 28. The event also included the presentation on bi-annual awards presented to local Polish American organizations celebrating milestone anniversaries (story on page 2).

At the Installation Banquet, Ann Bankowski addressed the gathered crowd, in her first speech as the PAC-MI President.

'Our organization, the Polish American Congress, Michigan Division with its splendid history of accomplishments in helping Poland when it needed our help, now itself, needs to look inward and discover the same purpose and determination to serve our cause," said Bankowski. "And that cause is not only to defend and support the interests of the Polish nation but to proliferate and defend our common heritage, good name and the history of contributions, we Poles and Polish Americans made here in America and around the world.'



"Here in America we can observe an ongoing process of societal changes where traditional aspects of our culture are under assault. Public education has pretty much abandoned teaching fundamental history and the significance and relevance of the American Constitution upon which this country was founded. And the general level of popular cynicism and corresponding withdrawal from public life and participation is on

the rise. One is led to conclude that in our diverse society only those versed in activism and those who are organized get to achieve their goals. My point is that all of you here have your own definitions of how things should be done, for example, how your local school should educate your children, how media should cover Poland and Polonia or how much value bicultural and bilingual upbringing can offer our children having a distinct and documented advantage in attaining success through education. These and many other issues matter to us. We want to be able to voice our opinions and affect others. It's difficult to do this on our own but much easier in one united and powerful voice such as that of the Polish American Congress. We are a national umbrella organization founded for that purpose. The work we do as a division and the goals we strive for should focus on serving our community but should also strengthen the national organization's goals and efforts. We are an organization that strives to unify and to speak as the voice of Polonia - how ever large and diverse it may be.

'My intention, and that of the Executive Board, together with the PAC membership, will be to work hard in facilitating these objectives. My method, let me be clear about this, will be to count on your understanding, your support, and your involvement. As they say, I will be calling you."

Additionally, Walter Bankowski presented awards to the Hamtramck Police and Fire departments, both celebrating 100th anniversaries.

Two special recognition awards were also given out at the banquet. Edward Maska was recognized for his continued help in maintaining the PAC-MI building in good condition and Zenon Stepien was recognized for his patriotism, especially for organizing monthly Masses for Poland (Msza za Ojczyzne) for the last 30 years.

PAC-MI remembers Katyn, Smolensk

The Polish American Congress Michigan Division organized the Mass of Remebrance on Thursday, April 9, at St. Faustina Church in Warren.

The Mass was celebrated to remember and honor the victims of the Katyn Forest Massacre of April 1940, commemorating the 75th anniversary of the brutal execution of more than 20,000 Polish officers, intellectuals, and clergy by the Soviets, as well as to remember the victims of the airplane crash near Smolensk on April 10, 2010, on the 5th anniversary of this tragedy, in which 96 members of Poland's elite died along with the late Polish President, Lech Kaczynski.

The Mass was celebrated by the Pastor of St. Faustina Parish, Fr. Bogdan Milosz, with participation of



"Filarets" choir, Polish scouts, members of the "Radio Maryja" family, veterans and other Polonian organizations.

The PAC-MI expresses its sincere "thank you" to everyone involved in helping organize the Mass and all who participated.

PAC-MI, Polish Mission hosted May 3 Constitution Day

The Polish Mission of the Orchard Lake Schools and the Polish American Congress - MI hosted the annual event commemorating the anniversary of Poland's May 3 1791 Constitution. It was the first Constitution adopted in Europe and second in the world, following the American one. It was a significant achievement of the Polish Enlightenment thinkers. The adoption of the May 3 Constitution provoked the active hostility of the Commonwealth's neighbors, leading to the Second Partition of Poland in 1792, the Kościuszko Uprising of 1794 and the final, Third Partition of Poland, in 1795. In the words of two of its co-authors, Ignacy Potocki and Hugo Kołłątaj, it was "the last will and testament of the expiring Fatherland."

Michigan's Polonia commemorated this Polish achievement on Sunday, May 3, on the grounds of the Orchard Lake Schools.

The event included performances by the students of the Polish Language Schools of Metro Detroit, commemorative address by Christopher Adamczyk (PAC-MI Vice President) and performance by violinist Joseph Greenbaum. Additonally, Marian Rogowski of Wyandotte's "Klub Polonia" recited a poem by Marian Hemar. The opening of the exhibit "Cum Tacent, Clamant" ("When they are silent, they shout") from the Institute of National Remembrance in Poland was also on the agenda of the day. The exhibition is devoted to the search for victims of the communist system who were murdered in Poland in 1944-1946. A Mass celebrated by Fr. Ludwik Madej (with music by "Filarets" choir) concluded the celebration.
